

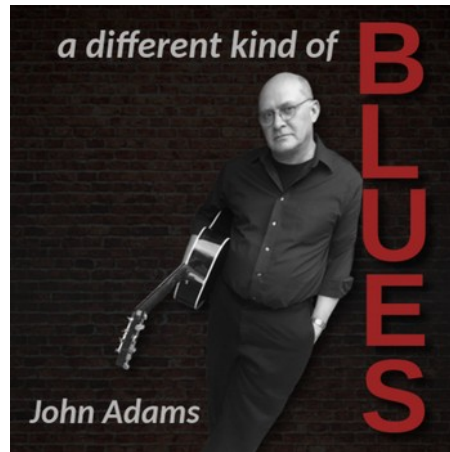

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Billings Singer/Songwriter John Adams releases new CD – A Different Kind of Blues

Billings, MT – John Adams, a regular on the Billings music scene, is releasing his third album of original songs entitled “A Different Kind of Blues”. The CD features a collection of what John describes as "Old Guy" songs about life from an older perspective. John sings and accompanies all songs on the album using his trademark fingerstyle guitar arrangements, and are reminiscent of John’s early songwriting influences, John Prine and James Taylor.

The CD’s official release date is January 17, 2020, and will be available for download through most on-line retailers (e.g. CD Baby, Spotify, iTunes, etc.); physical copies will be available on CD Baby, on John’s website (www.johnadamssings.com), and at all of John’s live shows. A CD Release event is planned in Billings, for January 16, 2020 and will be hosted at Yellowstone Cellars & Winery, 1335 Holiday Cir, Billings, MT. The Show starts at 7pm and will be a retrospective of John’s journey as a songwriter.

John is a member of the Nashville Songwriters Association International (NSAI) and founder of the Billings Singer Songwriter Festival and has been writing songs for over 30 years. John's writing style was heavily influenced by the songwriters of the 60's and 70's.

"In the 60's and 70's all the greats were still writing. On the country scene you had Tom T. Hall, Willie Nelson, Merle Haggard, John Denver ... and with the folkies it was Joni Mitchell, James Taylor, Harry Chapin, Jim Croce ... you couldn't listen to music back then and not be affected by it. We all learned what good songwriting was without even knowing it; it was just our steady musical diet." - John Adams

Today, John says he is most influenced by John Prine, who “can say more with a single line, than most of us can with a whole album”. You can definitely hear Prine's influence on this CD.
